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Frequently Asked Questions About Electronic Giving

<p>Q. What is electronic giving?</p> <p>A. Electronic giving is a direct payment program whereby your contribution is debited automatically from your checking or savings account.</p> <p>Q. What are the advantages of electronic giving?</p> <p>A. It makes it easy to fulfill stewardship Commitments.</p> <p>Q. How are my contributions automatically deducted from my account?</p> <p>A. Once you complete and sign an authorization form and return it to us, the contribution amount you specify will automatically be transferred from your bank account to the diocese bank account.</p> <p>Q. When will my contribution be deducted from my account?</p> <p>A. Your electronic contribution will be debited on the date you specify on the authorization form.</p>	<p>Q. If I do not write checks, how do I keep my checkbook balance straight?</p> <p>A. Since your contribution is made at a pre-established time, you simply record it in your check register on the appropriate date. Electronic contributions are recorded for you on your bank statement.</p> <p>Q. Without a canceled check, how can I prove I made my contribution?</p> <p>A. Your bank statement gives you an itemized list of electronic transactions. It is your proof of contributing.</p> <p>Q. What if I change bank accounts?</p> <p>A. Notify the diocese and we will give you a new authorization form to complete.</p> <p>Q. Is electronic giving risky?</p> <p>A. It's less risky than writing checks or mailing cash. Electronic contributions cannot be lost, stolen or destroyed and have an extremely high rate of accuracy.</p>	<p>Q. How much does electronic giving cost?</p> <p>A. It costs you nothing!</p> <p>Q. What if I try electronic giving and don't like it?</p> <p>A. You can cancel your authorization by notifying the diocese at any time.</p> <p>Q. How do I sign up for electronic giving?</p> <p>A. Complete and sign the authorization form and return it to the diocese along with a voided check or savings account deposit slip.</p>
