John B. Horn

John B. Horn is a graduate of West Point and holds an MBA from The Florida Institute of Technology. He served in the Army for 20 years, retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel. Following his Army retirement John worked in marketing and management for a Fortune 500 company for an additional 20 years.

John has been involved with assistance for the working poor population in Northern Virginia for over 20 years. He served as a member of the Board of Good Shepherd Housing and Family Services (GSH&FS) for 6 years and was President of the Board for two terms. Under his leadership the board and board working sub-committees were completely reorganized to focus on strategic objectives, to include increased community and business support for the organization and broader outreach for near and long term fund raising. John also spearheaded the organization's initiative to purchase apartments to offer below market housing to those served by GSH&FS. In recent years John led the organization's two major fundraising activities, raising over a million dollars, in the aggregate, to support GSH&FS programs for low income housing, emergency assistance, budget and family counseling and children's camps and activities. John currently serves as a member of the GSH&FS Housing Expansion Task Force which is pursuing a wide variety of innovative initiatives to team with local community and faith organizations to increase the supply of low income housing. In 2017 John received the Joseph T. Adinero Humanitarian award for his long term service with GSH&FS.

This past summer John initiated a one week New Horizons summer day camp for children of low income families. St Aiden's Episcopal Church, under the leadership of Father John Baker, conducted the camp in conjunction with First African Methodist Episcopal Church under the leadership of Pastor Abraham Smith. The camp utilized St Aiden's 6 acre campus. Children were provided with two meals each day and participated in a broad range of indoor and outdoor activities throughout the week. Both churches plan to conduct and grow the camp again in future years.
