General Convention Deputy Nomination

Ever since my baptism at Trinity, Fredericksburg, I have been serving the Diocese of Virginia in one form or another. From Parish Youth Ministries at Shrine Mont as a teen, to my gratitude as a queer young adult for the church welcoming me, to serving as a delegate to convention from the University of Virginia as an undergrad, and now as a priest back in the Diocese I love, Virginia has my whole heart! At UVA, I was involved with the Canterbury ministry and began my discernment for the priesthood through the Young Priest Initiative. After graduating, I served Buck Mountain Episcopal Church in Earlysville for a year in full-time parish ministry before matriculating at Berkeley Divinity School at Yale. While a seminarian, I began to serve the national church on an inter-seminary body exploring reconciliation which was slated to present at the original Lambeth Conference in 2020. Ordained into a pandemic in 2020, I am grateful to have landed at St. George's, Fredericksburg, first as Curate and now as Associate Rector. Coming full circle, I now serve YPI as a mentor, as well as on the diocesan Committee on Liturgy and Music and the Bishop Search Committee. I would bring a comprehensive sense of the breadth of this diocese, the particular experience of a young, queer priest, and a rather uncontrolled fondness for church bureaucracy to the work of General Convention.
