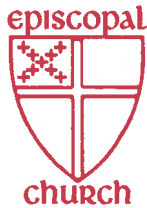

These different experiences have attuned me to the significant role culture plays in the work of ministry.

I serve in a rural ministry context and I believe it would be good for the values and perspectives of that context to be represented in our delegation to General Convention.
